 - (2) Articles: Reports important original results in all areas of polar science.
 - (3) Letters: Briefly presents novel and innovative findings related to polar science.
- (4) Trends: Reports important scientific news, information, and academic affairs, as well as major international programs or conferences in all areas of polar science.
